We will also be asking that ALL children from Reception to Year 6 come to school in their PE kits on their main PE day. Children will need their red PE Tea-shirt and black shorts, and their trainers. When the weather is colder, they can wear a pair of plain black joggers and their school jumper/cardigan.

We are requesting that all children have a pair of black pumps kept in school for any indoor PE sessions.

### **UNIFORM**

Can we please ask that **ALL uniform is labelled** with your child's name. That's **ALL** items of uniform. We always end the year with an enormous box of unclaimed uniform items as they are not labelled. Shoes, trainers, pumps, shorts, shorts, jumpers, cardigans, and even ties, all need to be labelled...and coats too!

Winter uniform is a white shirt or blouse with school tie. Boys have long, grey trousers; girls can have a grey skirt or pinafore.

**ALL children will need back, sturdy, polishable, shoes. Trainers or slip-ons are not allowed.**
