

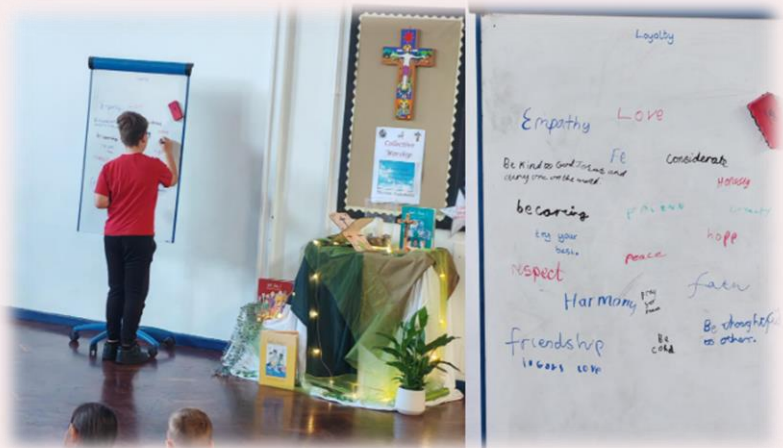

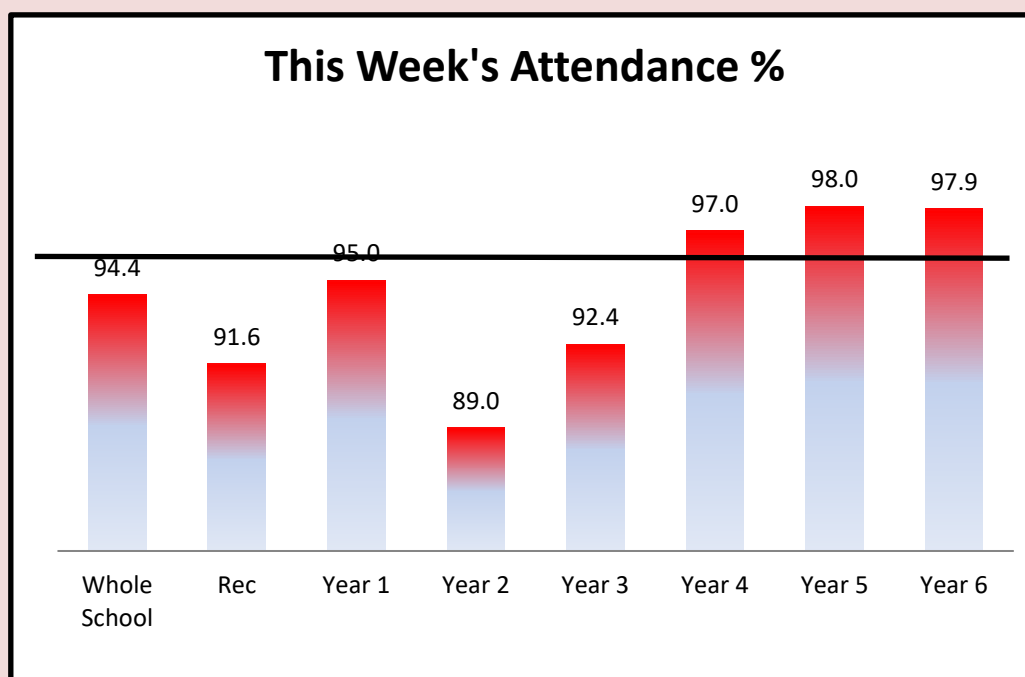
SCHOOL SHOES & UNIFORM

ATTENDANCE

Attendance in our first week back. **The school target is 97% - as represented by the black line.**

Attendance still remains one of the Government's key elements to improve. They expect children to be in school every day, unless of illness, which should be limited for the average child.



MADCOS PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT

MADCOS- Code of Conduct

As a cluster of schools, we work together to provide a quality education in nurturing, encouraging environments that both support and challenge our students to develop and flourish within our care. We collectively agree that this is a shared responsibility.

As parents/carers, we expect you to support our school rules, values & ethos through:

- ✦ Encouraging children to strive for the highest standard of personal, social and academic development and aim for excellence in all they do
- ✦ Maintaining attendance at school of 97% or above and ensure that all family holidays are taken outside of term time
- ✦ Understanding the need for high standards of personal presentation and ensuring children wear the correct uniform daily and bring the correct equipment in an appropriate school bag
- ✦ Supporting the school rules in behaving appropriately, working with the school and not against it and ensuring your child upholds the school's code of conduct both in and outside of school
- ✦ Treating each other and all adults with respect at all times
- ✦ Engaging positively with the school and attend meetings and events when invited to do so
- ✦ Informing the school of any concerns through the correct channels and lines of escalation. The school will decide on the correct member of staff to deal with any concerns and will respond with 48 hours
- ✦ Refraining from sharing negative personal opinions about staff and other children on social media platforms including WhatsApp and Facebook
- ✦ Supporting your child to be resilient when situations are challenging
- ✦ Accepting and actively supporting decisions the school makes about your child and trust that all professionals are working for the best interests of your child
- ✦ Supporting the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour, attitude to learning and safeguarding



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
