Today we have been reflecting on the life of Queen Elizabeth II following the sad announcement of her passing yesterday.

Queen Elizabeth dedicated her life to serve the people and many of us have lived through some joyous celebrations. We all celebrated the long bank holiday

weekend in June this year, with her Platinum Jubilee and some of you may be old enough, like me, to remember the celebrations of the Silver Jubilee!!!

Whatever your thoughts, most of us have only ever experienced Queen Elizabeth II as our reigning Monarch; life changed for us all yesterday.

The children have been taking time throughout the day to think out our Queen and her life of service. Some have watched the Newsround special broadcast – which is excellent – and the children's lunches were rearranged so we could watch the gun salute at 1.00 pm. We have also reflected on her life in assemblies today.

Miss Mawtus, and a fantastic group of helper in Y5, have set up a table of reflection in the school hall, with a Book of Condolences for children to record their thoughts and prayers for Her Majesty. We would love parents to come into the hall next week, when dropping off or picking up, and record their messages also; the children would love to see our community to be a part of this special time.

In the next week, we hope to improve the information on our school website and are waiting for our official photographs to be sent over so we can really get the web pages up to date.


To support your child's learning at home, all our subject leaders will be uploading our school's Knowledge Organisers to the curriculum pages.
